

**ORDINANCE
2014-01**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ISLAND HEIGHTS,
COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING
ORDINANCE 2005-08, 2006-11A, 2007-03, AND 2013-05
FIXING AND DETERMINING ANNUAL
SALARY AND HOURLY WAGE OF CERTAIN OFFICERS
OF THE BOROUGH OF ISLAND HEIGHTS.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF ISLAND HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows, until a subsequent salary ordinance is adopted:

SECTION 1: The maximum salary ranges per annum for the following officers and employees of the Borough of Island Heights shall be as follows:

<u>TITLE</u>	<u>TOTAL BASE SALARY NOT TO EXCEED</u>
W. Part Time and Other Hourly Employees (per hour)	\$20.00
Y. Municipal Court Administrator (per hour)	\$25.00

SECTION 2: The foregoing salaries and wage scales shall be retroactive to January 1, 2008. The step in the salary range for each employee shall be determined by the governing body.


SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted in connection with the aforementioned subject matter are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: If any part of this ordinance are held invalid for any reason, such decision shall not effect the validity of the remaining parts thereof.
